



## Babylonian Harlot - Apocalypse Series

On this 3-ounce pure silver coin, like the rest in the apocalypse series, the Babylonian harlot is engraved with an antique finish. This high relief digital print portrays the Babylonian Harlot on a beast with 7 heads with selective gilding on her hair.

According to the Christian Bible in Revelations 17, the Babylonian harlot is said to be the mother of all harlots, and a city that seduces and influences the kings of the earth and reigns over them all. There are only 500 pieces of this apocalyptic figure worldwide.



## Tiger - Mandala Collection

The tiger is a creature of mass, strength and danger. It symbolises these characteristics in many oriental cultures, especially in their fighting techniques. The mandala collection features animals of great interest like the Tiger.

On this 55mm coin weighing 2 ounces, the tiger is portrayed with a digital print, Swarovski crystal insert and an antique finish. The mandala collection is incomplete without this perfect depiction of strength, rigour and ferocity.

There are only 500 prints of this uniqueness of 99.9% pure silver all over the world.



## Helios - Divine Faces of The Sun

Helios is the Greek god of the sun. He is believed to be the actual personification of the sun itself. He is portrayed in the series of the 'divine faces of the sun' on an antique finish with selective gilding and amber, the sun.

He is shown to hold the sun in his hands within a 55mm coin weighing 3oz.

As the sun, he is believed to be an unbiased witness of all events under the sun. He is at times summoned in oaths. He figures in Greek literature and art to date



## Airmid - Goddesses of Health

In Irish Mythology, Airmid is believed to be the source of all healing herbs that sprout all over the world. She is depicted on this lightweight silver coin with digital colour printing, gloss over lacquer and antique finish.

This 50mm coin tells the story of one of the main deities of Pre-Christian Gaelic Ireland. According to the myth, her healing abilities took a powerful turn when her father murdered her brother out of jealousy.

Only Airmid knows the secrets of herbalism and this limited print takes you a step closer to those secrets.



## The Abduction Of Europa - Celestial Beauty

J Paul Getty Museum, California, houses a famous oil and single oak panel painting of Rembrandt Harmenszoon van Rijn, The Abduction of Europa.

As depicted on this 2oz coin across a 50mm diameter, the myth of the seduction and capture of Europa by Zeus lives on. Created with high relief features and an antique finish, only 500 pieces exist worldwide.

Europa, the princess of Argive, became the origin name for the European continent. With this coin, you hold a piece of Europe within your collection. Nothing is as extraordinary as that.

## My First Diamond - My First Treasure

Diamonds are precious ornamental substances that are also of industrial benefits. The first diamond was unearthed in India, in the 4th Century BC and is popularly associated with the silk road.

On this 0.5oz coin with a diameter of 40mm, the diamond is portrayed in all beauty and pride. The antique finish and high relief feature characterize the careful caving of the hardest metal on Earth.

Diamonds are beautiful metals, and this coin brings beauty to the collection of the 'My First Treasure Series'



## Athens - Ancient Heritage

Largest and capital city of ancient and present Greece is fitted on the 50mm coin weighing 2oz. It features the temple of Olympus with Zeus and other gods, made in high relief antique finish with unmatched hand polishing.

Athens is Greece's centre of commerce, administration, science, philosophy, art and learning. Great men such as Plato lived in it. The city is the largest preservatory site of ancient Greek heritage, culture and structures.

A coin such as this is an important historical holding and a solemn reminder of the origin of Greece.



## Macro Mantis - Macro Insects

Macro photography is becoming traditional in nature photography to magnify the tiny world of insects and other micro plants and animals. On this coin, the 'Praying Mantis' is portrayed in a closer perspective, on digital print, with an antique finish and high relief.

With its head fitted on a 2oz 45mm diameter coin, the natural details of the mantis are described in succinct details. The mantis style exists in the Chinese martial arts technique collection. There are southern and northern styles today.

Only 500 pieces of this masterpiece exist worldwide.
