

## Reggie Watts on Rolling Stone's website

Comedian Reggie Watts visited several of his former Great Falls haunts, which can be seen in a new photo exhibit displayed on Rolling Stone magazine's website.

The 15 photos in the gallery show Watts in his mother's living room, sitting in front of Crooked Tree Coffee, riding a scooter in an abandoned lot, sitting outside

Great Falls High and at Tracy's Diner downtown.

Watts writes briefly about each of the spots he's photographed in. He visited Great Falls in late August and was photographed by New York photographer Bex Finch.

In one of the photos he states, "My backyard. Many G.I. Joes and Matchbox cars are buried in this land. I used to sit in a lawn chair in the middle of the night staring up at the stars hoping I would see a

UFO. I don't think I ever did."

Another he writes, "These are my front steps. I grew up in this house from age 4 to 18 years old. My mom called for dinner from these steps at dusk. Romantic exciting non-cellphone times!"

Watts, 41, graduated from Great Falls High in 1990. He later moved to Seattle, where he performed in a band called Maktub.

After moving to New York to focus on his comedy career in 2004,

he was tabbed by late night host Conan O'Brien to open for his nationwide "Legally Prohibited from Being Funny on Television" tour in 2010.

More recently Watts can be seen on the IFC Network television show "Comedy Bang-Bang" where he is the band leader and co-host.
