Two businesses burn Saturday afternoon

On Saturday, June 22, at 4:08 p.m. North Comm Dispatch received multiple calls of a fire in a commercial strip mall in Escondido.

According to the Escondido Fire Dept., a large column of smoke was visible from a distance, and the call was upgraded to a working commercial fire. The first units arrived at 310 Andreasen Dr. and found a well-established fire in multiple suites of a commercial building. Quick actions by firefighters prevented the fire from consuming the entire building. However, fire heavily damaged four suites, and four were saved.”

Because of the fire’s growth and size—and after a portion of the building’s roof collapsed—a third alarm was declared, and units from multiple agencies responded to assist. Units from Escondido, San Marcos, Vista, Rancho Santa Fe, and Deer Springs were utilized, and Escondido PD provided traffic control.

The incident required 13 engines, 2 trucks, 3 ambulances, 3 battalion chiefs, 1 light and air unit, and 1 USAR in total.

The cause of the fire is under investigation. No injuries to firefighters or civilians were reported.

A GoFundMe page has been created in connection to the devastating fire that destroyed a magic store and sandwich shop in Escondido.

“Amanda and James Kellogg are now facing the terrifying reality of both of their businesses and only livelihood being completely lost in the fire. For the foreseeable future, they do not have in-

come.”\

Suspects arrested in stabbing

Six suspects were taken into custody Tuesday afternoon, June 25, in relation to a deadly stabbing that occurred earlier this year in Escondido, authorities say.

On April 27 at about 9:10 p.m., officers and fire personnel responded to a reported stabbing in the 1000 block of N Ivy St., arriving to find two males suffering from stab wounds.

One victim, identified as 37-year-old Jose Manuel Ramirez of Escondido, was later pronounced deceased at a local hospital.

The other victim was stabilized during his hospitalization and eventually released.

“Through a relentless and thorough investigation, detectives successfully identified four juvenile male and two adult male suspects in this murder. Over the last several days, all six suspects have been safely taken into custody”, police said Tuesday afternoon. “The juvenile suspects arrested include two 16-year-old males, a 15-year-old male, and a 17-year-old male.”

All four juvenile suspects have been

booked into custody at Juvenile Hall. 19-year-old Ricardo Fernandez and 22-year-old Jose Francisco Martinez were arrested and booked at the San Diego County Jail. All suspects are residents of Escondido.

“All six suspects were charged with 187(A)PC Murder: First Degree, 245(a) (1)PC Assault with a Deadly Weapon, and 186.22(A)PC Participate in a Criminal Street Gang,” authorities added. “Detectives

believe that all six suspects are gang members and that this murder was committed for the benefit of a criminal street gang.”

Local man advances to semi-finals on NBC's American Ninja Warrior

Escondido resident Alex Nye remembers the first time he seriously considered competing for NBC's obstacle course reality show American Ninja Warrior. He and his brother were fans and decided for his brother's bachelor party to attempt a ninja course at a New Jersey gym.

"We were kind of naturals based on our history and our monkeyish background—the things that we like to do—so yeah that was kind of an opening moment that maybe I could actually pursue this," he told *The Times-Advocate* in a recent interview.

Now Nye is a regular on the program, having appeared in three previous seasons, this year being his fourth. During the program's 16th season opener on June 3, he qualified for the semi-finals round for the third time in his career. But not without some drama.

"I did have a pretty dramatic near fall on obstacle four where I slipped in one hand and somehow recovered with one arm," Nye said with a bit of relief.

Originally from upstate New York, Nye says he has always been a bit of the "monkeyish" type.

Nye explains: "I grew up in Upstate New York on a bunch of land. So we kind of lived out in the middle of nowhere. So my brother and I were very outdoorsy kids. Cable TV didn't play much video games, so we spent all of our time outside climbing trees, snowboarding, skateboarding, all these just fun activities. My dad made us a rock climbing wall out of our chimney and he'd take us rock climbing. And so, it's kind of just in my nature to be like a climber and be outdoorsy and adventurous."

Those types of activities led him down a path of alternative sports such as rock climbing and parkour, the urban obstacle course racing. But the big shift really came when he moved to California. He first lived in the Santa Barbara area where there was a gym that featured rock climbing and gymnastics. There, he trained with fellow rock climbers, gymnastics athletes and parkour enthusiasts.

"It wasn't formal training," Nye emphasized, "it was just kind of learning-through-doing as an adult — just really a love and a passion for creative movement, and things like that. And through all those things this kind of old idea of trying ninja became more realistic."

Then, in 2018, he took the plunge and competed in the season 10 show.

"Everything up to the fifth obstacle went really well and it kind of played to my strengths," Nye recalled. "But then the fifth obstacle was a version of the flying bar. It was the lightning bolts, but that is where I had never really done a flying bar at that point. And so that's what took me out," he said. "I fell in the water."

Despite the fall, he still qualified for the semi-finals his first year and competed the very next night, but was disqualified when his foot skimmed the water during the very same obstacle - the flying bars. And as the saying goes, if you don't learn from history, you're doomed to repeat it.

"My second season I came across another flying bar type obstacle and unfortunately, I didn't learn my lesson from the first time," he admitted.

Not one to give up, he used the lesson to formulate a plan. "That experience is what kind of motivated me to build my own course," he explained. Around that time Nye was looking to buy a home in San Diego and came across the property in Escondido he eventually purchased in 2020.

"So, the very first thing I built once I had my house here was the Flying Bar and just repped that for a few weeks," Nye said. "And before I knew it, it became one of my biggest strengths because I got really good at it. So now, I was able to conquer that weakness and apply that moving forward to the show."

Nye's obstacle and training course in his backyard does more than just give him and fellow professional ninja competitors a place to train. He opens it up for amateurs and kids too as a way to promote the sport.

"Whoever is available or wants to come by and play around," is invited. And while, "sometimes it's like just a couple of training buddies of mine, other times it's like a bunch of kids." Nye says to visit his Instagram page "the.jungle.sd" to learn more about visiting his obstacle course.

When not training or competing for the show, Nye owns a fine art and architectural photography business as well as being a licensed drone operator. "I fly drones," he explains, "I'd say a lot of it is in the architectural industry. So I'll shoot the final beauty shots of a building for architects or developers and time lapses." Those interested can see his work at alexnyearth.com.

As Nye and American Ninja Warrior fans await his next appearance on the show airing August 12 at 8 p.m. on NBC or streaming on Peacock, he is keeping busy by qualifying for various other ninja league competitions, appearances on commercials and getting ready for the next season which begins

No time for a tea party

Every student of American history knows of the Boston Tea Party. During a winter night in 1773, the American Sons of Liberty boarded British ships in Boston Harbor and dumped 342 crates of tea into the harbor rather than quietly pay the taxes Great Britain proposed.

That tea would be worth about \$1 million in today's dollars. Original accounts called it “the Destruction of the Tea” and it became a defining moment in American history. Later called the “Boston Tea Party,” it represented our American dislike of taxes so much that we would rather destroy the goods than pay the tax.

Although we are now 251 years later and on the opposite coast, Escondido faces a similar defining moment. After twice being considered by the City Council and circulated for months for signatures, a proposal to increase our sales tax by one cent has become significant enough that in one fashion or the other, it needs to be on the ballot for Escondido voters to consider this November. But now is no time for another tea party.

In knowledgeable circles, Escondido's problem is called a “structural budget deficit.” Using the word “structural” means that on an ongoing basis, the basic set of ongoing and necessary revenues are not enough to cover the basic set of ongoing and necessary expenses. The normal belt-tightening, efficiencies, use of reserves and other tools simply don't work at some point. A change in the underlying structure is necessary. Government raises money through taxes and uses that money to provide services such as police and fire protection and public works services. It's a serious problem when the absolute basic cost of providing those services exceeds the absolute basic tax revenue.

Since at least 2017, city finance professionals have raised warning flags. Each year, our elected officials wring their hands, treat the yearly symptoms, and hope it will get better. Some years they sold off land, and some years technology and efficiency got us by. Use of reserves has also avoided disaster, and one-time federal money after COVID also hid the underlying disease for a couple of years.

Escondido's financial situation is no party. The budget adopted by our City Council earlier this month began with a net operating deficit of \$11,000,000. Staff recommendations to close the budget deficit included a combination of using reserve balances as well as once again deferring major purchases. Major purchases are things we might call basic such as replacing aging fire trucks, police cars, and street sweepers.

This year, with remnants of federal COVID money still remaining in some accounts, the City Council still managed to patch it together, although not without eliminating ten more employee positions. Assuming nothing breaks or goes wrong, they scraped by another year.

Cobbling together a survival budget has been going on for several years. When I was the City Manager in 2017, I wrote this to the City Council:

“It is my firm recommendation that our policymakers keep all options on the table to address the magnitude of the projected deficits which are forecast in upcoming years. These options will include consideration of new taxes and fees, complete elimination of certain programs, and radical restructuring of the City's operations and workforce. Staff will be working with the City Council to engage in thorough dialogue, build community consensus and develop strategies to address the challenge.”

Similar cautions have been made for several years. Meanwhile, the structural tumor remains: service levels continue to erode, equipment rusts and breaks, and buildings decay. A growing city continues to demand more from a deteriorating structure. And for Escondido's residents, nothing ever really gets better.

To their credit, the City Council considered putting a measure on the ballot in 2020, but it fell one vote short of the required super-majority required under the law. With COVID upon them, one veteran councilmember said, “Why not wait until after the November election to start making these decisions that a new council may have a completely different perspective on?”

However, a new Council did place it on the ballot in 2022 and while it came tantalizingly close to solving the problem, it failed by a few hundred votes.

Fast forward to today, and citizens have taken matters into their own hands by circulating an initiative measure for the last several months. It has now been submitted to the Registrar of Voters to determine validity, and assuming the required number of signatures are present, it deserves to be on the ballot.

Government needs money to operate just like a small business. We don't want the government competing with business, so we give the government money through taxes. How much those taxes are, and how they are spent are questions that require thoughtful leadership. I still chuckle when I think of the picture of the elderly man with the coffee cup in his hand saying “well, I paid my taxes last week so the roads should be fixed any day now....”

The virtue of local sales taxes like the one cent proposed by the initiative, is that every dime stays in Escondido. Not one dime is passed on to Sacramento. That money gets spent on our street workers, our policemen, our firefighters, and our landscapers. It provides the funding for improving parks, filling potholes, updating traffic signal software, building swimming pools, fighting homelessness, and having youth sports.

There is an additional urgency and time is not on our side. California law sets a base rate of 7.25% for these sales taxes, and further limits combined countywide taxes an additional 2%. That limit will quickly be reached by other countywide taxes that provide little or no benefit to Escondido. The existing TransNet Program tax is already .50% and SANDAG's November proposal is another .50%. Escondido's 1% needs to be secured and it needs to be secured now.

I will grudgingly admit that some things take time. But whether forced by the signature process or doing so on their own, I hope and pray that our current City Council realizes this is no time for a tea party. This is a time to exercise leadership by placing the local sales tax measure on the 2024 ballot. We all deserve to share in the decision to support a one cent increase and make our city a better place.

Payómkawish Highway

For over 10,000 years, the Luiseño people have lived in the San Luis Rey Valley. Historically, their villages extended along the coastline, and inland along the San Luis Rey River. The largest recorded village was known as Topomai, located in what is now Camp Pendleton. Other historic villages to the east included Páume (Pauma) and Palé (Pala).

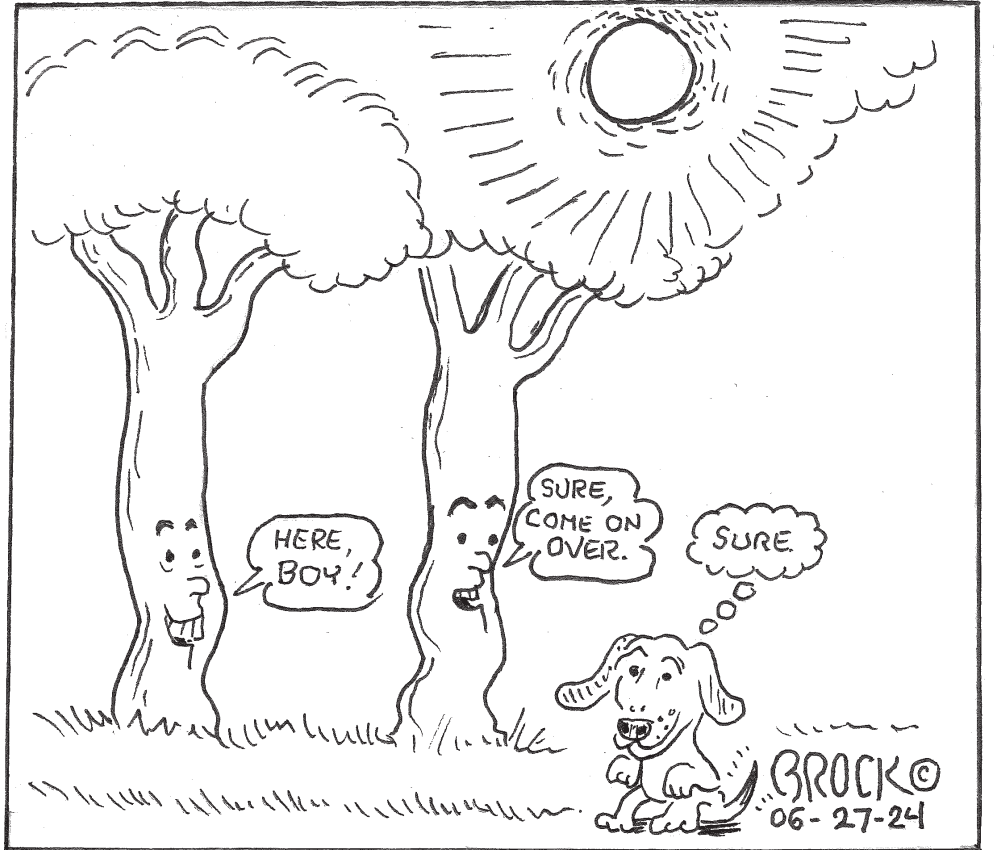
The current route of SR 76 was the main path the Luiseños used during their seasonal migrations back and forth from the ocean to the mountains. The historic and cultural significance of this transportation corridor deserves special recognition. Last week I introduced Assembly Concurrent Resolution 215 (ACR 215), which will designate a portion of State Highway Route 76 from Pauma Reservation Road to Rincon Rancho Road as the Payómkawish (People of the West) Highway.

Tribal people and sovereign tribal governments play a significant role in the 75th Assembly District. Local tribes are noted for their achievements in education, economics, and agriculture. They contribute to our economy through job creation, providing educational opportunities and enhancing community safety. They support local charities and assist local governments through planning and mutual aid agreements. As we all remember, their support in wildfire emergencies has been critically important. ACR 215 is a small step toward recognizing the history and significant contributions Luiseño people make to our state and region.

ACR 215 is supported by the Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians, the Pala Band of Mission Indians, the Pauma Band of Luiseño Indians, and the La Jolla Band of Luiseño Indians.

Join me in stopping the gas tax increase

A few weeks ago, I stood shoulder to shoulder with small business leaders and parents, united with the same message: **the gas tax must be stopped.** On July 1, the gas tax is set to increase by an additional 2 cents per gallon, bringing the total tax burden to a staggering 59.6 cents per gallon.

We are already grappling with the highest gas prices in the nation, rising utility costs, skyrocketing housing expenses, and an overall escalating cost of living. Government should be leaving people alone, not taxing more. This is not the time to add more costs to working families, businesses, and seniors. Government should be looking for ways to save people money, not to make our lives more difficult.

Next week, at the Board of Supervisors meeting, I will bring forward an agenda item urging the governor of California to stop this year's two-cent gas tax increase. If the state stops overspending, there is more than enough money in the state budget to cover these expenses. We constantly hear about a state deficit

due to overspending, yet they want to regulate us more instead of reining in their spending.

We have the highest gas prices in the country because of government policies. This is a government tax, not an increase by big oil. State policies are driving people out of California. I've spoken to many who simply can't afford to live here anymore.

Families are moving out, jobs are disappearing, and the next generation cannot afford a house. We cannot continue to burden everyone with additional taxes. The state faces a \$60 billion deficit this year due to overspending and over-regulating. Taxing people even more amidst the current high cost of living is not the solution. Let's give people a break. Let's stop the exodus from California and ensure our residents are not paying more in taxes.

3) 3 year phased approach

Types of fees included in the study are building, engineering, planning, fire prevention and non-development related fees such as the recreation and facilities rentals. The council voted 4-1 (with Consuelo Martinez dissenting) for Option 1, excepting some recreational programs, such as swimming lessons.

The annual cost to provide these services for the general fund is about \$12.8 million and the current annual fee revenue generated by these services is about \$7.8 million. "Which means," said Holmes, "the general fund is subsidizing these services by approximately \$5,000,000."

That's about half of the \$10 million structural deficit the city faces over the next five years—with an increasing deficit after that.

The options were prepared with feedback from the June 5 budget workshop. Holmes pointed out: "Option No. 1 moves all direct benefit fees to full cost recovery in year one with the exception of the recreation program."

A two year phase in would give time to communicate the changes to the community.

Robert Rhodes, assistant director of community services, reviewed recreation user fees. The learn to swim program charges about \$40 per session, however total cost is \$449. Staff recommended charging \$62 per session.

Mastering the Winds and Waves!

“And leaving the crowd, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. And other boats were with him. And a great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already filling. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke him and said to him, “Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?” (Mark 4:36-39).

The times in which we live are difficult and perplexing for many reasons. Much of society doesn’t honor God, and apart from God’s blessing we’ve created a confusing, complicated, overwhelming world that seem to go from bad to worse. On top of all that, the devil is on the loose, relentlessly, and unceasingly wreaking havoc in people’s lives.

Make no mistake, he’s been doing this since Adam and Eve came on the scene, but this is why God sent His Son, the Savior, Jesus Christ, to set us free from darkness and put His own authority into the hands of believers who would follow after Him.

One particular night on the Sea of Galilee, Jesus told His disciples, *“Let’s go across to the other side” (Mark 4:38)*. Jesus had a plan in mind that would set a region around Galilee free from the devil’s reign of terror.

As the disciples launched out in the boat, Jesus went to sleep in the stern, likely curled up and resting His head on a cushion. When suddenly, out of nowhere, winds came out of the north and seemed to smack the sea, causing the waves to act seismically, as if being tossed around in an earthquake. The disciples, several of them fishermen, knew the sea well, but this storm was so out of character, it caught them all by surprise. The disciples started working to fight the winds and waves, to no avail. The boat began filling up with water, and yet, Jesus remained asleep in the stern. Always remember this: The storm you can sleep through is the storm you have authority over.

They rushed to awaken Jesus, not gently, but shook Him almost violently, awakening Him with a start: *“Don’t you care that we’re about to die here? Don’t you care that we’re coming apart?”* Jesus quickly got up and rebuked the winds, speaking peace to the sea, and there was a great calm. He then turned toward the disciples and asked, *“Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?” (Mark 4:40)*. In other words, *“Why were you so afraid? Did you not realize you could have done what I just did?”*

So often, when confronted with something daunting, we clamor for answers, usually looking everywhere but where we need to look. Jesus knew there was more than just wind behind this. Someone was trying to keep them from reaching their destination. Jesus came to empower us to overcome the works of the devil, in His name. The devil, though relentless, only has the power we give him.

There was a divine purpose for going to the other side, and it’s usually when you’re just on the brink of a breakthrough that all of hell will attempt to stop you from fulfilling the assignment God has for you. But more about that next week.

“While this does not cover the full cost of service, it does demonstrate a desire to be more cost conscious while still providing a community benefit,” said Rhodes.

The next example was ballfield lights. The city charges recognized youth leagues \$5 per hour. Operation cost ranges from \$24 and \$45 per hour and doesn't include maintenance performed by Public Works.

Staff recommended \$24 per hour if the council wanted to move toward complete cost recovery.

Rhodes called facility rentals the biggest opportunity to bring fees toward full cost recovery. He gave as an example the Vineyard Room at the East Valley Community Center, which rents for \$80 per hour, but the actual cost to the city is \$147/hour.

Holmes said Option No. 2 would move all direct benefit fees to an 80% cost recovery in year 1 and full cost recovery in year 2. This would generate \$1.8 million annually.

Option #3 proposes a three-year phase in of fees to reach full cost recovery by year three.

Councilmember Mike Morasco led off the discussion, “From my perspective, I'm not interested at all in Option #3. It would be either Option #1 or Option #2.”

He asked how many city employees are needed in order to make the swim program work. “My recollection is that we may have more adult and or staff personnel there than what is required,” he said.

City Manager Sean McGlynn said, “We're actually staffing at the smallest level on the pool deck already.”

Councilmember Christian Garcia was also not interested in Option # 3 and leaned toward # 2.

Councilmember Consuelo Martinez said, “Option No. 1 is a ‘no’ for me. I do support that we move closer to full cost recovery on these other items especially because we are under charging compared to other cities in our region. But I just can't do that with recreation.” She added, “There's a huge public benefit with recreation keeping kids off the street—which ties into youth development, community services, public health, equity, crime prevention and gang prevention.”

She opposed Options #'s 1 & 2. “On Op-

tion 3, I think we do need to charge more for the other fees.”

Mayor Dane White supported “full cost recovery,” especially for rentals, but with a carveout for recreation. He favored increasing the cost of swim lessons “with the intent of getting to full cost recovery next year assuming the worst —assuming we're in a difficult position revenue wise, that program may be cut anyways. But if we find ourselves in a better situation that could still come back to council to be considered before full cost recovery was implemented.”

Morasco said, “Honestly speaking I never thought we would in regards to swimming ever do full cost recovery. It's impossible. No way we can charge \$443 or \$434. That would kill the program. It's going to have to be a loss leader, because there's no way in the world could you get full cost recovery.”

White moved for full cost recovery for regulatory fees and rents but to raise swimming lessons to \$62 this year; instructing staff to return next year with options including sustainability and full cost recovery.

Councilmember Christian Garcia seconded that, “I think we're all concerned about recreation. Something I always say is ‘Idle Hands are the Devil's Workshop.’ Meaning that we've got to keep kids busy.” There are nonprofits that could offer private swim lessons. “I just want to make sure we are not leaving a void.”

He was told that six or seven private organizations provide swim lessons, but exceed what the city charges. They range from \$88 to \$148 for a single 30 minute lesson. The city charges \$40 for a four day 30 minute lesson each day.

Councilmember Joe Garcia said, “We should go to full cost recovery for direct benefit fees. I also agree because of the situation that we're in that we raise the cost to market rate.” He said there was “no way” to charge full cost recovery for swim lessons. “It's unreasonable to believe we could do that but I think the information would be beneficial for us so we have our options.”

Trying to get full cost recovery for recreation programs would be the same as killing them, he said.

Budget Briefing

After the 4-1 vote, Holmes continued the

budget briefing, noting that in January the council approved use of \$3,033,490 in American Rescue Plan Act funds for the library management agreement. It also used ARPA funds for the Arts Center, (\$1,837,300). These are one-time funds. She noted the city contract with the Humane Society ends December 31.

The proposed budget eliminates 10 full time positions and eight general fund departments. However, it would add four police officers, cars and other items to increase the COPPS program by \$1.259 million.

The five year budget forecast shows the average annual deficit of \$8 million eventually growing to nearly \$20 million.

Police and fire budgets account for 71%, so although cuts to other departments will help, eventually the knife will fall on public safety. Unless a new source of income is found, she explained.

“If we assumed that projected deficit as \$10 million the Police Department would be directed to cut \$4.4 million and the fire department \$2.7 million,” she said.

Police have not given up

Police Chief Ed Varso explained the consequences of such cuts.

Morasco objected that the council has pledged not to cut public safety services. He asked why Varso was speaking on that scenario.

City Manager McGlynn said, “to remind the general public that although we've been successfully able to balance the budget, there's still the structural issue. Eventually because it is a \$20 million structural issue — without additional revenue there will come a time where these scenarios will have to be acted upon.”

Varso explained “Before I get into the doom and gloom bad news I'll get into some of the better news.” He noted that once EPD was budgeted for 170 officers but in 2008 that was cut to 160.

“One hundred sixty is inadequate and the budgeted number is on par with 1990 staffing levels and makes us the second lowest per capita police officer staffing in the county,” he said.

Despite that, “We go out every day and find ways to win—even when our state tries to find ways to stop us. We consistently excel in meeting all police department response time goals”, i.e. to have an officer on scene within 5 minutes of a 911 call. On average they arrive within 3 minutes and 43 seconds.

“This is only accomplished by the hard work and close coordination of our dispatchers, our field supervisors and police officers—who are very talented at multitasking, prioritizing and reprioritizing their work to meet the emergency needs in our community at any given moment,” said Varso.

EPD, he said, “makes more arrests than every other city in the county” except San Diego. “When other police departments have given up and other police

administrations have told their officers to back off on enforcement out of fear of lawsuits and public scrutiny—I have said ‘keep going.’ We work within the limitations of the law.”

He continued, “We are making an impact. That arrest rate is one of the clearest examples of a police department with a strong commitment to public safety.” EPD's reputation attracts officers to work here. “If you want to work in a city that largely supports the police—with a leadership team that gives you the equipment training and leadership you need to support you and do your job successfully, then Escondido PD is where you want to be.”

Training has been revamped to meet modern policing practices. EPD was the first in the county to get funding for rapid DNA technology, which will, he “result in more rapid criminal identifications; making Escondido a safer community.”

The COPPS unit “is having huge results on average,” resulting in fewer police calls.

He highlighted the successes because, “if the scenario I'm about to discuss were to actually happen—all of that hard work would be lost.” There is, he said, “very little to cut from the budget. I'd be forced to immediately cut professional staff positions that provide critical support to the Police Department.” Programs eliminated would include animal control services and all community outreach and prevention programs.

There would be no traffic safety promotion staff and only three officers to investigate serious injury and fatal traffic collisions. “Additionally we would likely give up millions of dollars in state funded grants related to Traffic Safety programs because we no longer have the staff available to focus on those efforts.”

Five detectives would be available to investigate thousands of property crimes every year. There would be “significant delays” in investigating property crime. He would have to eliminate two of five property crime detectives. “We would no longer investigate general thefts vandalisms shoplifting and auto theft.”

COPPS would be eliminated and no longer a COPPS team to remove encampments. Two of three officers assigned to schools would be eliminated.

Unable to staff the front counter, the department would go to an appointment only model. Officers wouldn't be available to enforce parking violations and the animal control contract would be cut to the minimum.

Police wouldn't be available to provide protection during some of Escondido's community's biggest special events.

Meanwhile the computer aided dispatch system dispatchers and police officers rely on to respond for calls for service and Escondido is now over 20 years old and experiencing significant operational issues. It will eventually reach a point of being beyond repair, he said.

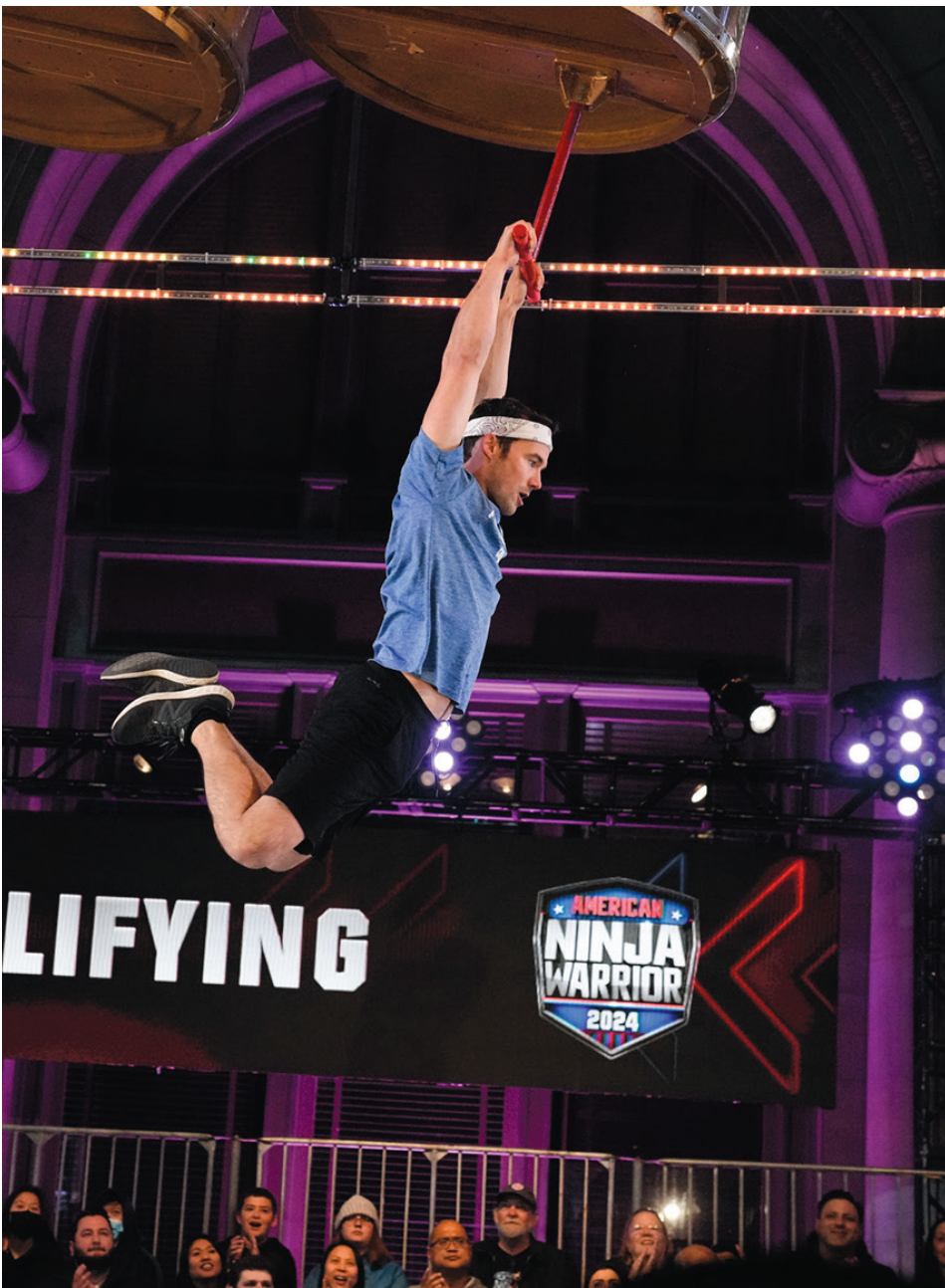
