Liquid diamond helps scientists build better atom bomb

GOVERNMENT researchers have developed a machine that uses sound waves so powerful they can turn a diamond – the hardest substance on Earth – into a puddle of liquid in seconds.

The scientists, working at the Sandia

Laboratory in New Mexico, subjected the diamond to the intense pressure of the sound waves – moving 20 times faster than a rifle bullet – in a reactor called a Z Machine.

The point of the experiment is to unleash the tremendous force contained within diamond atoms to start a nuclear reaction that would lead to a more devastating kind of atomic bomb than any known so far. Just what the world needs.

There are peaceful

advantages, however. The technology could be applied to turn half a bathtub full of seawater into the amount of energy supplied by 40 train cars of coal!

World's first robot musician strikes up the band

A ROBOT that can pick up the rhythm and intonation of other instruments and join in on a musical performance has been unveiled at the Georgia Institute of Technology.

Robots have been playing music for decades, but until now, they've only been able to play what's been previously programmed into their computerized brains.

Haile, as the new robot is

called, behaves more like a human musician, able to adjust its performance to fit in with what other instruments are doing, says its inventor, graduate student Scott Driscoll.

If the other musicians suddenly change the beat, Haile is capable of following their lead.

"Knowing that Haile is 'hearing' the music and responding to the tone, pitch and amplitude is quite moving," Driscoll says.
